# Fifth General Assembly of ISME

The Fifth General Assembly of ISME will be held at Bong Sen Hotel in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, from 19 to 24 August 2002. The Assembly is held once every three years. It was previously held in Yokohama (1990), Okinawa (1993), Hat Yai (1996), and Bali (1999). The Assembly evaluates the activities and finance of the past three years, and discusses the plans and finance for the coming next three years. In conjunction with the General Assembly, ISME will hold other meetings of ISME, including Workshops of the ITTO/ISME Projects "Global Mangrove Database and Information System (GLOMIS)" and "Action Plan on Mangrove Management." Meetings will be hosted and organized by the Mangrove Ecosystems Research Division (MERD) of the Centre for Natural Resources & Environmental Studies (CRES) of the Vietnam National University. Local arrangements will be made by Prof. Phan Nguyen Hong, the Vice-Director of the CRES, and his secretaries. Outcome of the Assembly will be reported to members through the next issue of Newsletter.

## ITTO Mangrove Workplan

International Tropical Timber Organization (ITTO) has recently adapted its Mangrove Workplan to provide guidance for the Organization's future work in promoting the conservation, rehabilitation and sustainable management of mangroves, for the years 2002-2006. The Workplan gives insights into the area of activities that are seen as priorities by the Organization for future project work. ISME assisted ITTO in preparing the Workplan. The Workplan is published and will also be made available to the public on the ITTO Website.

# ISME Action Plan on Mangrove Management

projects. ISME has appointed Dr. Francois Blasco of the Laboratory for Terrestial Ecology, Toulouse, France, as the Pre-Project Coordinator. He is specialized in remote sensing and also engaged as chairman of various national and international committees. Your input on information of the past and present mangrove projects is appreciated.

## **Mangrove Training Course**

The annual Mangrove Training Course "Sustainable Utilization of Mangrove Ecosystems" has been implemented by ISME since 1995 with financial support from Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA). The Course has received 54 participants from 30 countries since 1995. Participants this year are eight from seven countries (Bangladesh, Myanmar, Oman, Philippines, Tanzania, Thailand, and Vietnam). Curriculum of the Course is composed of lectures, laboratory work, and mangrove field surveys at several islands in Okinawa Prefecture where the largest area of mangrove forest is distributed in Japan. The Course invited 40 lecturers locally and internationally including some **ISME** members who presentations on, for example, mangrove biology, physiology, fisheries, management and conservation, etc. Several joint lectures and field work were held together with another training course of JICA entitled "Conservation and Sustainable Management of Coral Reef" to learn and exchange the current situation of mangrove and coral reef ecosystems.

## **ASPACO**

With UNESCO-MAB and UNU, ISME will organize an international meeting of ASPACO (Asia-Pacific Cooperation for the Sustainable Use of Renewable Natural Resources in Biosphere Reserves and Similar Managed Areas) in Okinawa, 1-6 October 2002. ASPACO is a project of UNESCO, objectives of which include identifying national strategies for biodiversity protection in biosphere reserves and similar managed areas with special emphasis on coastal areas, small islands and mangroves. The Project is a follow up to the Action Plan proposed at UNU-ISME-UNESCO/MAB Okinawa International Workshop "Asia-Pacific Cooperation on Research for Conservation of Mangroves" held in March 2000.
